Requirements for the Documentation of the Honors Project

The final format of an Honors Project should conform to a standard format of the Candidate's discipline. The Honors paper <u>must be double-spaced with a 1 ½-inch margin on the left side of the paper</u> (to allow for binding); 1-inch margins on the top, bottom and right side of the paper are required, as are page numbers at center top or bottom.

The title of the Honors paper should conform to one of the following models (or an appropriate modification of it in the case of the creative arts):
