Technical Information

In Spring 2016, 1,665 graduating seniors and recent graduates from 5 institutions took the at-graduation FDS. In Fall 2016, 2,016 recent graduates from 12 institutions took the post-graduation FDS. After administrations closed, we gave institutions the opportunity to make changes to information from recent graduates who had responded to the survey or to add information for graduates who did not take the survey but for whom they had collected information in other ways (via web searches, information from the alumni office or from faculty, etc.) This report contains the most current data we have on 3,158 recent graduates from 12 institutions, including data graduates submitted via the survey and data that institutions submitted or modified.

We use the term "knowledge rate" throughout this report to parallel the term the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) uses. We define "knowledge rate" as the percent of graduates who received degrees between July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2016 and who have any information recorded about their primary activity following graduation, including those who answered 'None of the above' for the first question on the survey. Although some respondents took the survey as seniors in anticipation of their graduation, we refer to all respondents included in this report as "recent graduates" since institutions have confirmed that all these students graduated.

Throughout this workbook, the race/ethnicity disaggregation relied on institution-reported data and excluded any respondents whose race/ethnicity was coded as "Unknown" (IPEDSRaceEthnicity=9). The "White only" category shows data for respondents whom institutions coded as "White" (IPEDSRaceEthnicity=5), while the "All other known race/ethnicity (IPEDS categories)" includes respondents coded as American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian American/Asian, African American/Black, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic or Latino/a, not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, and two or more races.

Throughout this workbook, the major disaggregation relied on institution-reported data. Because institutions listed majors that were specific to their individual campuses, we recoded the 100+ reported majors into 11 general categories derived from the National Survey of Student Engagement's (NSSE) analyses. We then grouped single-major graduates and double-major graduates who had both majors fall into the same category into these 11 NSSE categories. Double-major graduates who had one major in the Art & Humanities category and the other in Social Sciences were grouped into a category we named, "Art & Humanities/Social Sciences." All other double-major graduates were grouped in a category we named, "All Other Double Majors." For more on the NSSE major categories, see:

Only graduates who took the post-graduation survey in the fall had the opportunity to answer the question, "How satisfied are you with your current primary activity?", shown on the "2. Satisfaction" worksheet.

In the "4. FT Employment Compensation" worksheet, to calculate the "Annual Salary for Full-Time Hourly Employees" (hourly wage × hours worked per week × weeks worked per year), we made the following assumptions:

* Full-time employment for hourly workers = 30-40 hours per week. Therefore, we only looked at hourly wage earners who reported working 30-40 hours per week in the survey.

* Hourly wage earners did not work more than 40 hours per week (i.e., no overtime pay). We excluded hourly employees who said they worked over 40 hours a week because we could not determine their overtime pay.

* Hourly wage earners consistently worked the hours they reported throughout all 52 weeks of the year (i.e., they are not a seasonal employee).
