HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

MARY L. BEER RN, MPH
Doctor of Science

A public health expert on the frontlines during extraordinary times, Mary L. Beer has demonstrated wisdom, grace and indispensable leadership. Working tirelessly for safe and thriving communities, she has led Ontario County Public Health since 2008, managing disease prevention, health education promotion, and community health protection for more than 100,000 residents, including Genevans and the Hobart and William Smith campus.

A registered nurse with more than 40 years of experience, Mary Beer oversees the county's COVID-19 response, implementing safety guidelines, investigating and containing outbreaks and managing public communications. With decisive leadership and thorough planning, she has steered Ontario County residents through unprecedented challenges with clarity and courage.

During her career, Mary Beer has been a tireless advocate for public health laws that have, among other successes, reduced smoking rates across the county. Under her direction, the county has successfully developed and implemented programs to decrease obesity, manage hypertension, prevent suicide and fight the scourge of the opioid crisis.

A leader in her field and an advocate for county citizens, Mary Beer is the past president of the S2AY Rural Health Network board of directors, where she helps lead the nonprofit's work with regional and local health departments to improve the health and well-being of residents by promoting health equity. Devoted to serving members of the Finger Lakes community, she is a member of a number of local boards, an active hospice volunteer and a longtime Rotarian.

With respect for her long and consequential career, gratitude for her remarkable leadership throughout the pandemic, and deep admiration for her relentless service on behalf of the health and wellness of all Ontario County residents, Hobart and William Smith Colleges honor Mary L. Beer.



CHRISTOPHER N. LAVIN '81
Doctor of Humane Letters

With his inspiring vision of civic responsibility, Christopher N. Lavin '81 has rallied Geneva's resources — its leaders and institutions, community and capital — and directed them where they are needed most.

An experienced communicator with decades of experience in journalism and public relations, Christopher Lavin has helmed the Geneva Community Center and the Boys & Girls Club since 2015. Under his leadership, these community cornerstones have expanded their scope to engage more and more residents with programs and initiatives focused on health, education, and arts and entertainment.

With foresight and a collaborative approach to serving Geneva's needs, Christopher Lavin has been a critical force in elevating the relationship between the city and the Colleges. In association with the Colleges' Center for Community Engagement and Service Learning, he oversaw the formation of the HWS Geneva Corps, which today includes dozens of HWS tutors who mentor local students and propel the success of the Geneva 2030 initiative.

As COVID-19 emerged, the Boys & Girls Club pivoted from afterschool programming to ensuring that everyone in the Geneva community had secure sources of food. Since March 2020, Christopher Lavin and his team of volunteers have served thousands of hot meals to families affected by the pandemic. He has been tenacious in this service, negotiating with farmers and grocery stores, Hobart and William Smith and Sodexo, even making personal deliveries door-to-door so children do not go hungry.

Christopher Lavin grew up in Geneva, attending St. Stephen's, DeSales and then Hobart College – all on Pulteney Street. He has been a reporter and editor at newspapers across the country, from the *Finger Lakes Times* to the *Rochester Times-Union* to the *San Diego Union-Tribune*. He has served as director of communications and taught journalism at the La Jolla Country Day School, in La Jolla, Calif. In all of these roles, he has demonstrated integrity, sincerity and a deep care for the success of those his work has touched.

For his close attention to Geneva residents and the community's diverse needs and opportunities; his responsive and imaginative leadership in an unprecedented moment in our history; and his committed engagement with the Colleges to ensure those efforts achieve their fullest potential, Hobart and William Smith Colleges honor Christopher N. Lavin '81.



COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER AND
RECIPIENT OF THE ELIZABETH BLACKWELL AWARD

CARLA D. HAYDEN
Doctor of Humane Letters

A trailblazing librarian, educator and public servant, Carla D. Hayden is a powerful voice for literacy, increasing access to information and the opportunities that result from the simple act of reading. As the 14th Librarian of Congress and the first woman and the first African American to lead the national library, she holds a pivotal position in documenting, preserving and proliferating the intellectual and creative life of the United States.

Carla Hayden has led a distinguished career, championing literature as the fundamental vessel for capturing and inspiring the breadth of human experience and possibility. As former president of the American Library Association, former CEO of the Enoch Pratt Free Library in Baltimore and former deputy commissioner and chief librarian of the Chicago Public Library, she has created programs and strategic plans to amplify libraries' community value and their impact on the vibrancy and character of our society.

An outspoken advocate for young readers in particular, Carla Hayden is a role model who understands the power of books to reflect and to enlighten — to be, as she has said, “a mirror and a window.” In the books, *A Frontier of Librarianship* and *Venture into Cultures*, she has provided roadmaps for librarians and educators to innovate, explore and engage students in multicultural, interdisciplinary themes and subjects.

From Chicago to Baltimore, Pittsburgh to Washington D.C., Carla Hayden has helped people across the country uncover the depths of collective knowledge that the library holds. With passion and respect, vision and intelligence, she is a voice for the needs of the nation's reading public and for the ideals the library represents: that a diversity of ideas and viewpoints is the basis of a rich, equitable and intellectually curious culture.

Today, we honor Carla Hayden with both an honorary degree, making her a member of the Hobart and William Smith community in perpetuity, and also with the Elizabeth Blackwell Award, given to women whose lives exemplify outstanding service to humanity. The Blackwell Award is named in honor of Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell, known worldwide as the first woman to receive her degree as a Doctor of Medicine and who graduated from Geneva Medical College, a precursor to Hobart and William Smith. Carla Hayden joins distinguished women who have received the award including Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Janet Yellen, Eunice Kennedy Shriver, Madeleine Albright, Billie Jean King and Dr. Wangari Maathai Sc.D. '94, P'94, P'96.

For her remarkable professional accomplishments and her exceptional dedication to serving the public; for her tireless efforts to promote and enhance a national culture of literacy; for her belief in and devotion to the rights of citizens to learn broadly, deeply and freely; and for her exemplary and groundbreaking leadership as the first woman and first African American to serve as Librarian of Congress, Hobart and William Smith Colleges honor Carla D. Hayden.



TOUCHING THE FUTURE AWARDS

Christa McAuliffe, the first teacher selected to participate in the Space Shuttle program and who died in the explosion of the Challenger, expressed the sentiments of many teachers when she said, “I touch the future, I teach.” Today, we celebrate and embrace the faculty at Hobart and William Smith Colleges who have touched the future of our graduates by their interactions these past four years. We also celebrate and honor the many early childhood educators including those in elementary, middle and high schools who have led our graduates to this place and this very special day.

To that end, the Hobart and William Smith Board of Trustees established the “Touching the Future” awards in 2004. This year, we honor three distinguished educators.

Laura Burrell Baxter, Director of College Advising at the Key School in Annapolis, Md., was nominated by Edith R. Falk '21, who notes that “Laura is one of the kindest, most passionate, and hardworking people that I have ever met.” Falk, who found HWS thanks to Burrell Baxter, says “the trait about her that I will always appreciate the most is...her unshakeable belief that each and every one of the students she works with has a place that they belong and where they fit, and that she can and will help guide that student to find it.”

Dave Trejo, Principal of Environmental Charter Middle School in Gardena, Calif., was nominated by Robert I. Padilla '21, who was inspired by Trejo’s mentorship to become a leader himself: “Mr. Trejo always told me, ‘It’s not about what you do, it is the reason why you do what you do. Always ask yourself ‘why am I doing this?’” Following Trejo’s advice “to be a role model to my peers,” Padilla became a Resident Assistant at HWS, not only “to develop good relationships” with other students but also to “lead by example,” carrying forward “the influence Dave Trejo had on me while I was a student of his.”

Megan Wright, High School English teacher at Alexander Central School District in Alexander, N.Y., was nominated by Joshua K. Hylkema '21. In Wright’s class on the literature of World War II and the Holocaust, Hylkema says he was challenged “to think openly” and taught “how to engage with such a difficult subject,” which “sparked my passion and compelled me to continue learning about the Holocaust and identity politics.” From his religious studies coursework, to his participation in The March: Bearing Witness to Hope program in Germany and Poland, Hylkema says Wright’s teaching has profoundly “shaped my education at HWS even to this day.”

A NOTE ON ACADEMIC ATTIRE

Academic regalia worn at commencements and on other ceremonial occasions at colleges and universities serves not merely to lend dignity and color but to reveal different types of academic achievement through the use of distinctive styles of gowns, hoods and varying colors.

The earliest gowns, of which illustrations exist at Oxford University, somewhat resemble cassocks and were worn by teachers who found good use for the hood, or cowl, as protection against the weather. Today's academic dress is essentially the same as that standardized in the United States by the Inter-collegiate Code adopted in 1895. It includes the familiar square mortarboard cap with a tassel, in addition to three styles of gowns and hoods for bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees.

The American mortarboard, derived from the soft Oxford cap, is usually black. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is also usually black, although gold tassels may be worn by holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions. The tassel is worn on the right side of the cap by undergraduates, on the left by holders of bachelor's and higher degrees. Graduates of certain institutions and members of the Board of Trustees wear a soft, round cap in the style worn by medieval scholars.

There are three academic gowns that are usually black but are otherwise differently styled. The bachelor's gown has a long pointed sleeve, the master's a long closed sleeve with a slit for the arm at the elbow, and the doctoral a very full, bell-shaped sleeve with three velvet bands matching the velvet facing of the gown opening. Velvet on the doctoral gown often is in a color appropriate to the wearer's field of study, and the gown itself sometimes is in color, such as blue for Yale, or banded in color, as in gold for Johns Hopkins.

It is the hood that generally provides academic attire its color and offers the most information about the wearer. The silk lining of the hood bears the color of the degree-granting college or university, with a chevron used for a second color if needed; its velvet edging, or facing, reveals the color assigned to the area of study. Members of the graduating classes who have earned Latin praise wear a bronze medallion depicting the seal of their college; a bronze neck ribbon signifies *cum laude*; a silver neck ribbon, *magna cum laude*; a gold neck ribbon, *summa cum laude*. Members of Phi Beta Kappa are identified by blue satin stoles. Members of other honorary societies wear thin cords bearing the colors of the honorary society. Those elected to Sigma Xi wear blue and white honor cords. Those receiving Honors wear thick gold cords. Members of Posse wear white stoles.
